CALIFORNIA SCHOOL BOARDS ASSOCIATION (CSBA) SUPERINTENDENT'S ADVISORY COUNCIL

Superintendent Potter is honored to have been selected by CSBA to serve a second term on the CSBA State Superintendent's Advisory Council. There are approximately 10 superintendents statewide out of about 1,000 that serve on this Advisory Council. On Thursday, January 19th, Superintendent Potter traveled to Sacramento to attend one of three CSBA's Superintendent's Advisory Council meetings. The CSBA's Superintendent's Advisory Council helps model governance team principles that CSBA advocates for local districts, addresses major policy issues, and provides advice on urgent matters in districts or on public education issues. The Council brings together the experience and expertise of board members and superintendents from a diverse range of LEAs to promote a greater understanding of the critical role both serve in local districts. The Council meets approximately three times per year (February, May, and October) and conducts at least one conference/video call.

During the meeting CSBA had presenters from the Department of Finance and the California Department of Education addressed topics such as the Governor's Proposed Budget, mental health, late start, the CA Dashboard, and more. Vernon Billy, the Executive Director of CSBA co-led the meeting with the Advisory Council Chair. The SDUSD Superintendent Lamont Jackson began his first term during this meeting.
