






#### **INNOVACION WINTER PROGRAM 2025**

We'd also like to extend a heartfelt congratulations to our entire Child Nutrition Services Department for their outstanding efforts in boosting both student and staff involvement in the creation of freshly prepared meals. Their commitment to excellence is evident through initiatives like engaging taste tests, which have fostered a greater sense of connection and excitement around healthy, delicious food options!

Our served breakfast count has increased by 129%, from 94,575 to 216,206 and our served lunch count has increased by 123% from 324,911 to 723,627! Way to go Child Nutrition Services, you are truly our lunch heroes!!
