EDUCATIONAL LEADERSHIP, PUPIL SERVICES AND SAFETY

GOVERNOR'S SAFE SCHOOLS FOR ALL PLAN

Recently, Governor Newsom pledged to advance, with approval by the California State

Legislature, California's Safe Schools for All Plan. The plan is built on four essential pillars: Funding, Safety and Mitigation, Oversight and Assistance, Transparency and Accountability. The link to summarize the plan is here: Summary: California's Safe Schools for All Plan

Utilizing the four pillars, this plan would prioitize opening schools for grades TK-2 "as early as" Feb. 15th and progress to opening schools for grades 3-6 "as soon as" March 15th. School districts will be responsible for updating the safety plan for reopening schools which is based on the four pillars. A key data point to re-open schools has now been set at a case rate of less than 28 per 100,000 for a county. At this time San Diego county's COVID case rate is above the 28 per 100,000 requirement embedded within California's new plan for reopening schools. Thus, elementary schools not yet open in our county will need to wait until the COVID case rate in San Diego drops below 28 per 100,000 to open. San Ysidro School District will most likely open schools after the state's Feb. 15th beginning target date due to the current COVID surge we are experiencing in southern California.

VACCINATE ALL 58

Recently the new initiative Vaccinate All 58 was released by California. The primary goal of Vaccinate All 58 is to successfully administer the COVID-19 vaccine to everyone in all of California's 58 counties by summer 2021. Distribution of vaccinations in San Diego county have begun for individuals falling within Phase 1A which primarily includes healthcare personnel and long-term care facility staff and residents.

Our district nurse and school health clerks fall within Phase1A and are now eligible to make an appointment for the COVID vaccine.

Essential workers within education are prioritized in the multi-tiered COVID vaccine distribution grid within Phase 1B. This will expedite the vaccination delivery to school employees which in turn will assist in the opening of our schools. Vaccination is one of the four pillars presented in Governor Newsom's California's Safe Schools for All Plan. STAFF COVID-19 TESTING COVID-19 TESTING FOR ALL SCHOOL STAFF

Our district has implemented COVID safety procedures that have been effective within our schools, facilities and our YMCA program. We encourage staff and families to practice COVID safety measures at all times outside of the workplace and schools, which include but are not limited to: face coverings, social distancing, hand washing, and adherence to state and county health guidance regarding gathering restrictions.

Thanks to the County of San Diego and San Diego County Office of Education, our district staff is able to be tested for COVID-19 safely, and at no cost. As of October 1st, testing sites were opened throughout the county. These sites aim to produce results sooner than 48 hours after an individual is tested. This is helpful as it supports our number one priority of keeping all SYSD schools and facilities safe.

All district employees working onsite shall test for COVID-19 every other month. All school districts have access to the free County of San Diego COVID testing locations. County's public testing sites

NEW COVID RELIEF FEDERAL STIMULUS FUNDING FOR SCHOOLS

The federal government has authorized new COVID federal stimulus funding to support schools nationwide to implement safety guidelines and reopen schools. California is estimated to receive approximately \$6.8 billion of the \$54.9 billion (ESSER #2) in COVID-19 relief funding for K-12 schools.

Allowable expenditures for this federal stimulus funding are detailed on the California Department of Education website:

Allowable uses for this round of ESSER funding includes the following:

- 1. School facility repairs and improvements to enable operation of schools to reduce risk of virus transmission and exposure to environmental health hazards, and to support student health needs
- 2. Inspection, testing, maintenance, repair, replacement, and upgrade projects to improve the indoor air quality in school facilities, including mechanical and non-mechanical heating, ventilation, and air conditioning systems, filtering, purification and other air cleaning, fans, control systems, and window and door repair and replacements
