






















































### SUPERINTENDENT'S STUDENT ADVISORY COUNCIL

### DRUG AWARENESS WEEK AT VISTA DEL MAR MIDDLE SCHOOL

San Diego County District Attorney, Summer Stephan, visited Vista Del Mar Middle School where she participated in a comprehensive and powerful presentation on how to stay safe from the drug fentanyl. This presentation is part of San Ysidro School District's Red Ribbon Week program.

All 7th grade middle schoolers from VDM got the opportunity to interact with presenters and ask questions regarding fentanyl, exposure to drugs, and safety tips.

A Prevention Specialist for the Institute for Public Strategies South Bay Program, formed part of this presentation, in which she spoke about the dangers and exposure to drugs and drug dealers via social media. She also talked to students about how they can reduce the risk of

being exposed to fentanyl, overcoming peer pressure, coping skills, and how to seek behavioral health resources.

San Diego County District Attorney, Summer Stephan, has dedicated her life to protecting children, families, and communities that are most vulnerable to drug and human trafficking.







### AMAZON BEGINS COLLABORATING WITH SAN YSIDRO SCHOOL DISTRICT
