Congratulations to Mr. Madera on this well-deserved award. His leadership, passion, and commitment made a profound difference, and the district was grateful to have him leading the way.




#### LA MIRADA ELEMENTARY CELEBRATES VALENTINE'S DAY WITH A FUN TEAM BUILDING PICNIC

Ultimately, this fantastic opportunity contributed to building a more proficient and well-trained transportation team, promoting higher standards in the safety and efficiency of services provided to students and families.



Another example of how this growth pathway benefited district colleagues and the district was Veronica Alvarez, one of the dedicated custodians, who successfully passed all bus driver-required examinations, including her CHP driving test, achieving a perfect score!
