The purpose of the event was to highlight the incredible work of school social workers who balance resiliency, passion, and perseverance while simultaneously serving students, families, and staff members in districts and schools across San Diego County.

Karina Victorino, District Social Worker was nominated for the SDCOE School Social Worker Direct Service Award. Her nomination was for the important services that she performs to support students with Mental Health needs. These services range from Tier 1/2/3 interventions, including Educationally Related Mental Health Services (ERHMS), staff and parent training, and outside agency collaboration.

COVID CASE DASHBOARD

This Dashboard is an effort for our district to be transparent regarding COVID cases. Our dashboard reflects the number of cases since July 26 and through March 11. Most of these cases have been "contact traced" to places other than school sites. This past week, our schools again witnessed a dramatic drop in cases among our students and employees, as compared to prior weeks after winter break. The district's multi-layered safety measures are proving highly effective in curbing the transmission of COVID within our schools. At the March Governing Board Meeting, outdoor masking and amending the COVID-19 Safety Plan will be an agenda item.
