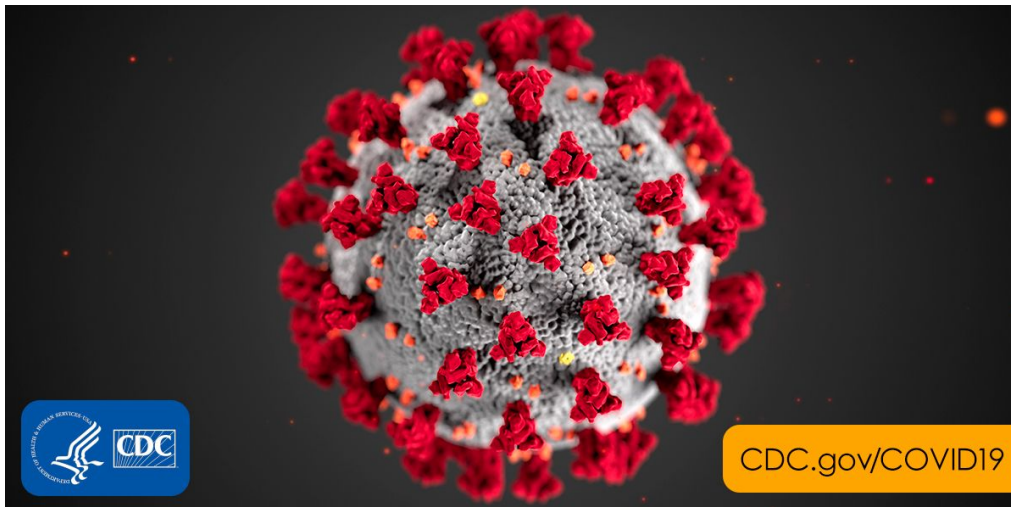

## SUPERINTENDENT

### WORLDWIDE CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) PANDEMIC



In the last two weeks life as we know it has dramatically changed as a result of the worldwide coronavirus pandemic. With just over 2 months passing since the COVID-19 reached the United States in January 2020 the rate of rapid transmission has caused nationwide school and business closures, governmental social distancing orders, an economic downturn, and fear for the health and safety of our society's vulnerable individuals.

This week our district closed all 7 schools along with the rest of the school districts in San Diego county in an effort to slow the curve of COVID-19 so as to save lives and to provide time for the health care industry to better manage the increasing patient flow. On the eve of March 19th, Governor Newsom announced a statewide "**Stay-At-Home Executive Order**" and directed the roughly 40 million residents of California to stay home with the exception of essential service sectors. Today our state has over 6 million K-12 students home and our school districts statewide are working hard to determine how to create and deploy distance learning options.

I applaud the leadership and valiant dedication of our Governing Board Members, our management team, our union leaders and our remarkable staff for the incredible commitment they have displayed this week as our district worked hard to continue to implement health and safety measures, to deploy meals to our community, to shift over 500 employees to a Google telecommuting work platform, to envision distance learning options, and to explore the viability of providing technological learning tools for our students while learning at home.

We express our sincere gratitude to our students and families as they dramatically shift their way of life by having their children stay home and as they collaborate with our district to find ways for them to learn at home.

Together our community will unite in a spirit of solidarity and we will support each other through this worldwide health crisis to save as many lives as possible.

## DISTRICT SCHOOL VISIT OF SAN YSIDRO MIDDLE SCHOOL

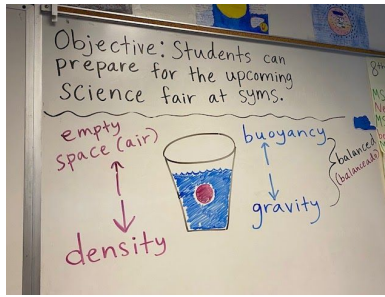

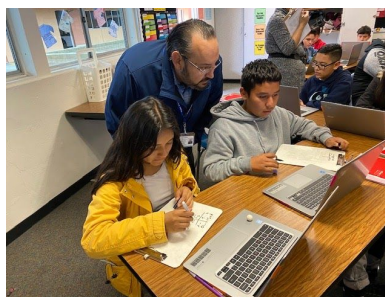
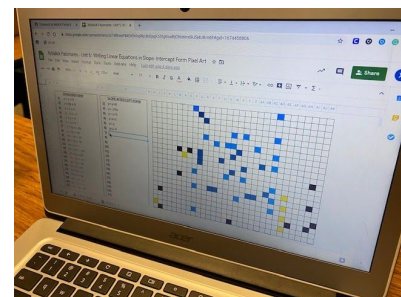

[Distance Learning Guidance from CDE](#)

The California Department of Education created the following guidance concerning how districts can provide distance learning opportunities for students. For the purpose of this guidance, “distance learning” means instruction in which the student and instructor are in different locations. This may include interacting through the use of computer and communications technology, as well as delivering instruction and check-in time with their teacher. Distance learning may include video or audio instruction in which the primary mode of communication between the student and instructor is on-line interaction, instructional television, video, telecourses, or other instruction that relies on computer or communications technology. It may also include the use of print materials incorporating assignments that are the subject of written or oral feedback.

LEAs will need to assess their ability to deliver instruction both in an online setting and also in a non-technological setting, keeping in mind that not all children and families have access to devices or high-speed internet, and that the LEA may not be able to meet the needs of all its students through online instruction.

Elements of the plan might include, but not be limited to, the following:

- Short- and long-term goals, accounting for the length of time currently planned for the school site to be closed and for the possibility that the closure may need to be extended based on the best evidence available in the future

- Plan to assist teachers in analyzing the course sequence prior to closure so that they can develop a plan to cover the content and standards necessary to complete the planned course syllabus and to provide training on how to continue to deliver instruction
- Continuum of delivery options for various grade levels, such as a fully online curriculum or online curriculum with individualized or small group interaction with teachers.
- Continuum of delivery methods, such as a combination of technology, innovative use of other media (such as television), paper packets, or onsite meetings for a limited number of students, consistent with social distancing requirements
- Plan for how to allow teachers to engage with one another to calibrate on offerings for students, exchange of effective practices, or adjusting approaches to ensure engagement with students.

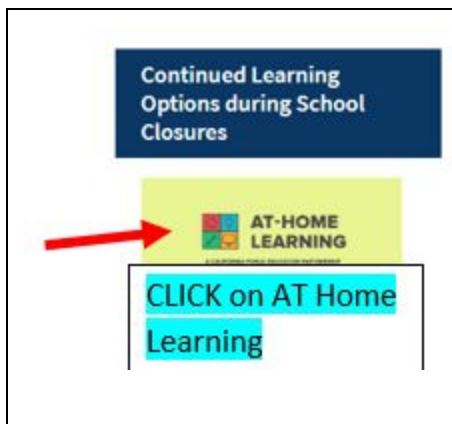

#### Broadcast Resources

Beginning Monday, March 16, KPBS 2 will broadcast 12 hours of programming selected to meet the TK-12 California educational standards.

The programming will be from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. in viewing blocks by grade level:

- o 6 a.m. to 8 a.m. - Grades TK-3
- o 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. - Grades 4-8
- o 1 p.m. to 6 p.m. - Grades 9-12

#### How to Watch

A student does not need access to a computer or the Internet to watch. Tune into KPBS 2 with an antenna at channel 15.2, or on Cox 811 or Spectrum 1277.
