

ACSA LEGISLATIVE ACTION DAYS 2023

The Association of California School Administrators (ACSA) held its 43rd Legislative Action Days (LAD) Event on April 17-21, 2023. As ACSA's state Vice President for Legislative Action (VPLA), Dr. Potter was incredibly honored to lead this event which brought 19 ACSA regions together to advocate on behalf of education with state legislative leaders. Meetings were scheduled in the Capitol with almost 100 out of the 120 legislators in the Capitol!

The united focus areas of educational advocacy efforts to support education for California's 6 million students were: 1) Robust and Stable School Funding; 2) Preserving the Arts, Music, and Instructional Materials Block Grant; 3) Safe and Modern Schools; 4) Staff Shortage: Recruitment and Retention; and 5) Streamlined Accountability.

The first day of the LAD event included a welcome by ACSA VPLA Dr. Potter and ACSA Executive Director Edgar Zazueta. Senator Joshua Newman provided a Keynote address as the Chair of the Senate Education Committee, followed by both an Assembly and Senate Legislative Panels from key staff members representing education and finance. The second day included the Superintendent of Public Instruction, Tony Thurmond as the keynote speaker, recognitions for both Assemblymember Al Muratsuchi and the Education Policy Advisor to the Governor, Brooks Allen, and a Governor's Administration Panel.
