Statement from the State Superintendent of Public Instruction Tony Thurmond

SACRAMENTO—State Superintendent of Public Instruction Tony Thurmond issued the following statement in response to today's guilty verdicts in the trial of former Minneapolis police officer Derek Chauvin:

"Today's verdict is an important and long-overdue step for accountability, yet tremendous work remains if we want to truly eliminate the systemic racism that persists in all of our institutions—including public education—and which has denied students and communities justice for generations."

SAN YSIDRO CHAMBER OF COMMERCE EDUCATION COLLABORATIVE MONTHLY MEETING

On Wednesday, April 21st the SY Education Collaborative held their virtual monthly meeting. Collaborative Chair, Cynthia Nagura, led the meeting which included community, business and educational leaders joined in a partnership to provide service and support for San Ysidro children and families. The various Task Forces and Committees include: STEM Initiative Task Force, Scholarship Committee and Emergency Task Forces; Family Full Services Support and Educational Support. These Emergency Task Forces have been instrumental during the pandemic. The Family Full Services Support Task Force has provided families with information and assistance with access to social services and recently held a job readiness workshop and job fair to address the staggering unemployment that our San Ysidro families have faced.

The Educational Support Task Force has helped our families overcome the challenges with distance learning and WiFi access through parent workshops and providing mental health and social emotional resources for parents and students. Superintendent Potter provided an overview on the reopening of our schools for the Hybrid Learning Program, CDPH COVID Safety Guidance for graduation ceremonies, and the development of Summer School Programs. Other topics on the agenda included an overview of the Promise Neighborhoods program and a possible Town Hall meeting with a county leader to discuss priorities in San Ysidro including the County's role during the pandemic and how to continue supporting our families through the recovery process.

Project SAVE (Scheduling Assistance for Vaccine Equity) sets aside appointments for people who are in the currently eligible groups and at high risk for complications from COVID-19.

The reserved appointments will be filled through outreach by community health workers or promotoras who are contacting people 65 and older at locations that include grocery stores, faith centers, food distribution sites and housing complexes in the South Bay."
