On April 25th, 120 7th grade students from San Ysidro Middle School participated in the 7th Grade Internship Day. The Internship Day is intended to allow students to get first-hand, hands-on experience on how a business functions, learn about some of the positions/personnel required to have a successful operation of a mall, connect skills that are learned in the classroom to skills needed to be successful in the workforce, start thinking about future plans after high school and what careers they may want to explore. Students also learned about the connection of going to school, college or a trade school and how this impacts choices for jobs & careers in their adult life.

Students were prepared by teachers in the classroom and during an internship day training. Prior to departing to the outlets, the students were given a presentation in the SYMS MCC to further prepare them for the days' events.. The presentation, titled "Priority Industry Sectors in San Diego", was given by Jose Rivera, Project Specialist for the Work Based Learning Department of the San Diego County Office of Education.

Seventh Grade Internship Day resumed after a 3 year hiatus due to the COVID pandemic. News stories featuring the return of our event were broadcast on KPBS, CBS 8, NBC 7, Telemundo, and Univision.

2ND ANNUAL DISTRICT STEM FAIR



Mr. Mata received his award at the CALSA Southern Region Honoring Our Own Reception on Wednesday, May 17th.






2023 SCHOOL CLIMATE CONFERENCE

COAST 2 COAST FEDERAL ADVOCACY IN WASHINGTON, D.C.

Board Member Rudy Lopez and Superintendent Gina Potter attended the ACSA/CSBA Coast 2 Coast Federal Advocacy event in Washington, D.C. on behalf of our school district. The first day of educational policy issues were specific to California and consisted of a briefing on the latest politics affecting federal education policy and collaboration opportunities with prominent D.C. figures and fellow educators. The training was then followed by two days of meetings on Capitol Hill to advocate directly with California congressional representatives, White House officials, key federal agency leaders and other top policy makers. Several school districts from San Diego county attended this successful federal legislative event. Top education legislative topics that were addressed included: fully funding the federal special education promise of 40%, continuing broadband access funding, universal meals, educator staffing shortages, and mental health funding.
