### **SUPERINTENDENT LETTERS TO FAMILIES REGARDING REOPENING WITH HYBRID LEARNING PROGRAM**

Hello San Ysidro School District Families,

I am excited to announce the reopening of our schools beginning next week on April 12th with the launch of our Hybrid Learning Program! Our educational team is eager to welcome students back to school and to see the joy that will come with students seeing and interacting with both their teachers and friends in person. For our preschool and kindergarten students, there will be the eagerness and anticipation of coming to school for the first time. For our 6th and 8th grade students, they will have the wonderful opportunity to end the school year with their friends and to experience end-of-year activities that make school come alive. Below this letter and on our district website please find the elementary and middle school schedules beginning next week for both the Hybrid Learning Program and Distance Learning Academy.

To our families, I sincerely thank you for your patience and dedication to your child during this most difficult academic year as you have stayed by your child's side and diligently supported them with their distance learning and now hybrid learning programs. As parents, you have served as the most critical support system for your child this year, and for this we express to you our sincere gratitude.

It is with our district theme of the year, "TOGETHER" or "JUNTOS" that we will bring each other the caring, courage and strength we need to safely reopen our schools for our students. Early on in the pandemic our Governing Board Members identified safety as the top priority for our district. I am proud to share with you that our district's facilities and maintenance team have implemented the highest standards of safety recommended for schools by the California Department of Public Health. The multi-layered safety measures implemented in each of our schools includes: cloth and

disposable masks for all students and staff, distancing protocols, hand washing/sanitizing, posting of safety signage, daily cleaning and disinfecting of classrooms and schools, daily temperature and health screening, enhanced air filtration upgrades in every classroom, asymptomatic COVID testing with parent permission, vaccine access to all district employees prior to schools reopening, and more.

Spring has brought a sense of hope as our county was placed in the Orange Tier on April 7th, 38.5% of individuals in San Diego have had their first vaccine and 22.7% have been fully vaccinated, over 90% of individuals 65 and older in San Ysidro have been vaccinated, and the majority of schools throughout the state will open if they are not already reopened this month of April. Also, on April 6th, the Governor announced an aspirational goal of reopening the state economy by June 15th, which means the COVID colored tiers would be discontinued and schools may be able to fully reopen for full in person instruction by the beginning of next school year.

Thank you for coming together as a united community to help one another survive this pandemic. It is our community's caring, patience and flexibility that makes us strong and extends humanitarian kindness that continues to bring us hope that life, as we once knew, will be restored.

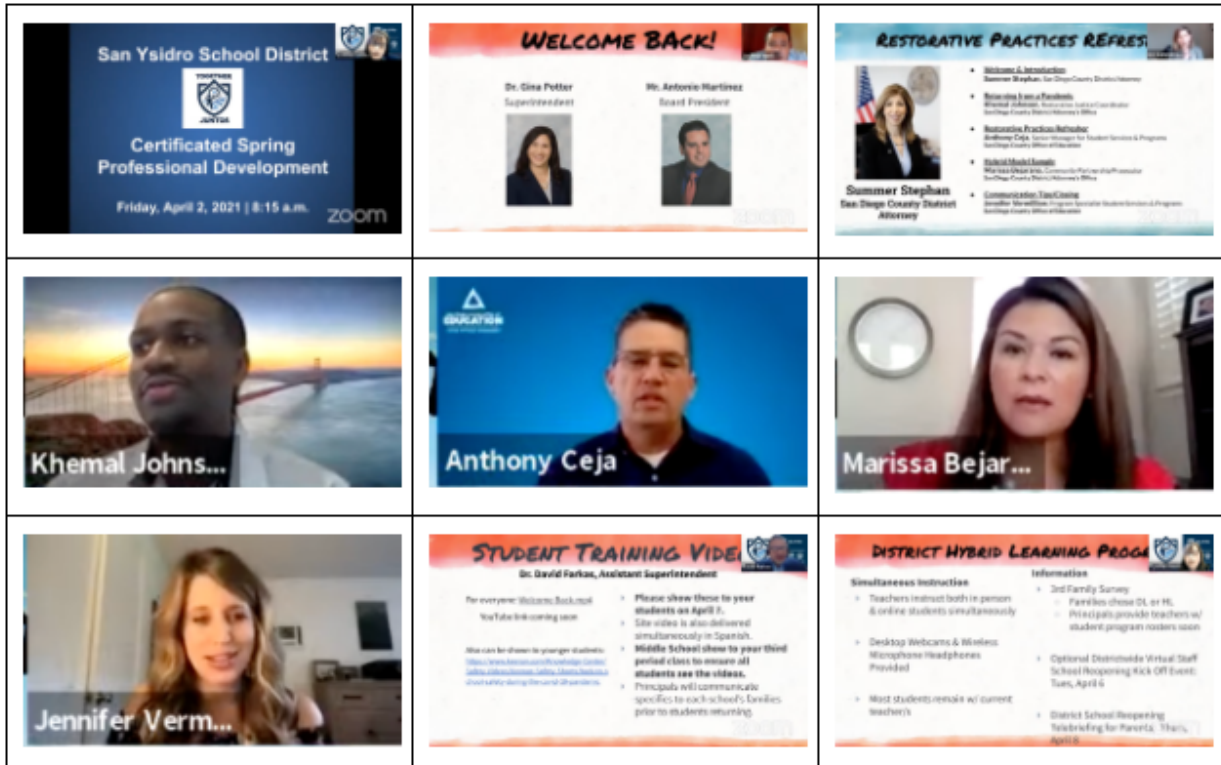

## **CDPH GRADUATION UPDATES K-12 AND INSTITUTES OF HIGHER EDUCATION**

K-12 Graduation updates have been shared by the California Department of Public Health (CDHP) as of March 30th. The following information was taken from the attached presentation that was provided by CDHP.

All commencement ceremonies shall:

- Adhere to attendance limitations as defined within the current CDPH Outdoor Seated Live Events and Performances Guidance.
- Outdoor, in-person ceremonies are permissible, consistent with this guidance.
- All attendees, including school staff, performers, students and families are counted toward any occupancy capacity limit.
- If multiple ceremonies are planned for a single day, schools must allow for at least two hours between ceremonies to prevent mixing across attendees.
- Audience seating must be fixed or marked, with readily identifiable signs to indicate by section, row, and seat.

As we continue to make improvements as a county on our tiered status, these limitations will be likely amended to meet the criteria of the current situation.

## **BOND SALE UPDATE AND TIMELINE - REFUNDING 2012 COPS AND CFD #3**

This bond sale will allow the district to refund the 2012 Certificates of Participation (COPS) which will generate approximately \$5.7 million in savings to the district which may be used on facility related construction projects in the future.
