PROMOTION CEREMONIES

Our schools are working hard to provide joyous promotion ceremonies for our preschool, kindergarten, 6th grade and 8th grade students. The preschool and kindergarten ceremonies will be held as car parades, so parents/guardians you may want to decorate your cars for your child's big promotion day. 2021-2022 VIRTUAL LEARNING ACADEMY ORIENTATION AND CONTRACT REQUIRED

While the vast majority of our students districtwide will return to full in person school when the new school year begins on July 26th, 2021, there are some families that are choosing to keep their child in the Virtual Learning Academy. The Virtual Learning Academy will require families and students to view the online Virtual Learning Academy Orientation (available to view beginning on Friday, June 4th) and to complete and submit the Virtual Learning Academy Contract by Tuesday, June 8th. The Virtual Learning Academy Contract serves as a commitment by the parent/guardian and student for successful attendance, engagement and academic progress. Additionally, the Contract delineates expectations that the student will keep their video camera on during all instructional lessons, complete assignments, actively engage in the learning process, take certain assessments in person at a school location, and more.

Important note: the district strongly encourages families to consider placing their child in the full in person learning program next school year as the research indicates that most students learn best at school. Students who participate next year in the Virtual Learning Academy will be required to maintain positive attendance, engagement and academic proficiency. Students who struggle within the Virtual Learning Academy may be placed by the district in the full in person instructional program at the end of an elementary school trimester or middle school semester period to ensure their academic success.

VIRTUAL 2020-2021 EMPLOYEE RECOGNITION CEREMONY





- Topics to be covered include navigating COVID-19 stressors, the dangers of social media and human trafficking, drugs, and gangs.
- Additional community resources are offered to families participating in the program such as food, clothing, housing, and counseling.
