FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL: MONDAY, JULY 25TH

Dear Families,

Our Governing Board Members and I are excited to welcome you back to the 2022-2023 school year! We are so proud of the notable accomplishments our district achieved last school year and we look forward to continuing to build on our successes for students this year! Our district is sensitive to the significant impact the COVID pandemic has had in our community and in our schools over the past 2 years. With this in mind, our Governing Board has identified the theme for this school year as "Rise Above" or "Asciende" as we strive to return to a more normal life at school, at home

and in our community. Our district is working together as a strong united team to implement our vision and mission which focus on student achievement.

District Vision:

The San Ysidro School District, in partnership with our teachers and community, is committed to providing a high quality, multicultural learning environment that promotes academic excellence, social responsibility and physical and emotional well-being for all students.

District Mission:

Quality education and opportunity for all students to succeed.

The first day of school for all students is Monday, July 25th. Each school is mailing or emailing letters to families this week welcoming students back to school and either providing your child's teacher classroom assignment or indicating the date and time of a school orientation with classroom schedule information. If your family does not receive a letter from your child's school by Thursday of this week, please call or visit your school's office for support as soon as possible. Schools are unable to place a student in a class or provide classroom teacher information to families that have not yet registered their child for school or have not submitted verification of residency information. To ensure the safety of our students and staff the district asks that all students take a COVID self-test on Sunday, July 24th prior to beginning the first day of school on Monday, July 25th. The district provided free self-test kit distributions for families on July 18th and 19th, and COVID self-test kits are available at the district office receptionist area. If your child tests positive for COVID please contact the school office for support and guidance. COVID positive individuals are required to quarantine. Independent student study contracts will be made available by schools for students in quarantine. The California Department of Public Health COVID safety guidance for schools indicates face masks are not required, however they are strongly recommended indoors.

The **7th Annual Families First Resource Fair** has been scheduled for **Saturday**, **July 30th 8:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. at San Ysidro Middle School**. Our district is grateful to the community organizations that donate backpacks and school supplies for distribution to students at this event.

All school offices and the district office are open every day this week to assist families with student registration, verification of residency, transportation requests, before and after school program applications, and more. On Wednesday, July 13th and Thursday, July 14th our management team kicked off the new school year by participating in the annual Leadership Academy. The Leadership Academy consisted of team building activities that promoted trust, communication, teamwork and creativity. Also, each Cabinet/Department covered professional development topics such as the mission, vision, LCAP Goals, data, SABERs, threat assessment protocol, staffing, evaluations, collective bargaining agreements, COVID protocols, school finance, McKinney-Vento, etc. The new district theme of the year "RISE UP/ASCIENDE" was introduced to the Management Team. MILITARY & FAMILY LIFE COUNSELOR

Our Military School Liaison Mindy Hayes shared that Leidos, the Navy contractor overseeing the Military & Family Life Counseling program, has been able to hire a Child & Youth Behavioral Military & Family Life Counselor (CYB-MFLC) to support Ocean

View Hills Elementary and Vista Del Mar Middle School. Her name is Holly Gines and will start on July 21, 2022.

A CYB-MFLC provides confidential non-medical counseling to military-connected students and their families to help participants learn to anticipate and resolve challenges associated with the military life. CYB-MFLCs may observe, participate and engage in activities with children, provide coaching, guidance and support to staff and parents; and model behavior management techniques for staff and parents.

We are excited to be able to provide additional support to Ocean View Hills and Vista Del Mar military families.

DIAMOND SAFETY TRAINING

On June 13th through June 16th, several staff participated in a five-course Diamond Safety Team Series. The team consisted of Efrain Burciaga (Sunset School Principal), Irene Herrera-Cevalls (Vista Del Mar Middle School Principal), Laura English (La Mirada School Principal), Manuel Bojorquez (San Ysidro Middle School Principal), Maria Connie Rodriguez (Willow School Principal), Russell Little (Smythe School Principal), Erika Meza (Ocean View Hills School Principal), Mathew Bandy (Vista Del Mar Middle School Assistant Principal), Frankie Asio (Willow Campus Security), Terry Williams (Ocean View Hills Campus Security), Kirstine Hernandez-Flores (Willow Psychologist), Denise Villezcas (Lead Psychologist), Rick Quintana (Lead Psychologist) and Superintendent Dr. Gina Potter.

The Diamond Safety Team was packed with teamwork exercises designed to educate and explore the roles of each Diamond Safety Team member. This dynamic, but sensible approach to school safety took participants through an actual case in which the application of a variety of prevention, intervention, and response techniques and protocols proved to be critical to the outcome of the case. The participants leapt past the theory phase of school safety and landed in the fast-paced world of life-saving execution and decision-making. Topics included but were not limited to: Threat Assessment; Building a Positive School Culture and Climate; Developing Effective Campus Security Teams; Options-Based Response Strategy; and Stop the Bleed certification course.



EXPANDED LEARNING PROGRAMS - SUMMER SESSION

The school district launched its annual summer programming on June 13th with 3 programs this year. The three programs were:

- Youth Excellence and Success (Y.E.S.) Academy: College for Kids @ Southwestern
- 2. Expanded School Year (ESY)
- 3. Expanded Learning Opportunities Program

These programs worked together to bring our students a broad range of enrichment and learning opportunities during the summer intersession.

As part of the District's Gifted and Talented Education (GATE) program the district offered all eligible 4th-8th grade students an opportunity to attend the Southwestern Colleges Y.E.S. program. 

















EXPANDED SCHOOL YEAR (ESY)


EXPANDED LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES PROGRAM
