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San Ysidro Elementary Schools Show Significant Academic Improvement According to The Latest California Department of Education School Dashboard Report

San Ysidro – According to the latest California Department of Education School Dashboard Report released in December, San Ysidro School District elementary schools achieved significant academic gains! All five elementary schools, La Mirada, Ocean View Hills, Smythe, Sunset and Willow showed substantial academic progress in at least one of the following areas; math, language arts or progress towards English language proficiency.

This notable progress signifies that our District is consistently moving forward with our goal to provide students a more rigorous curriculum along with a school environment that is conducive to learning and equity.

Here are the spotlights according to the California Dashboard results for each elementary school showing increases:


La Mirada:

- Increase of 23.8 points in Language Arts
- Increase of **17.7 points** in Math
- **57.1%** making progress towards English language proficiency (considered high progress)

Ocean View Hills:

• Increase of 15.8 points in Math







Smythe:

- Increase of **14.6 points** in Math
- Increase of 5.3 points in Language Arts

Willow:

- Increase of 11.9 points in Language Arts
- Increase of **11.7 points** in Math

Sunset:

• Increase of 6.9 points in Math

San Ysidro Middle School & Vista Del Mar Middle School:

• Highlighted for their work in implementing the Positive Behavior Interventions & Supports (PBIS) structure which is helping foster a productive school culture.
