BASIC FUNCTION: Directly responsible to the Director of Special Education and to the school principal when on school site. The adapted physical education specialist provides instruction, services, consultation, planning, evaluation and remediation for the improvement of physical education for individuals with exceptional needs.

REPRESENTATIVE DUTIES: (Incumbents may perform any combination of the essential functions shown below. This position description is not intended to be an exhaustive list of all duties, knowledge, or abilities associated with this classification, but are intended to accurately reflect the principal job elements.)

- Communicates effectively and appropriately with the pupils so as to develop their ability to exercise self-restraint, self-control, and a sense of responsibility to individuals and groups.
- Personally exercise proper care in the use care of school equipment, facilities, and materials and instills this same sense of responsibility in the students.
- Maintains proper health and safety at all times.
- Provides necessary assistance to enable pupils to achieve maximum motor development
 commensurate with their abilities; to enable them to move with ease, self-confidence, and a
 sense of wellbeing; to utilize movement as a satisfying means of expression; to develop and
 maintain a high level of physical fitness; to attain desirable social growth and development; to
 utilize acquired motor and movement skills in worthwhile leisure activities; to keep
 themselves healthier by avoiding actions that are harmful and by forming habits that are
 beneficial.
- Participates in parent-teacher activities and other such activities designed to enhance the school-community relationships.
- Maintains promptness and accuracy in making reports and keeping records.
- Plans, organizes, and directs activities to supplement the regular physical education program activities.
- Assesses pupil progress in terms of short and long range program objectives using observations.
- Demonstrates qualities of initiative, dependability, resourcefulness and industry.
- Works well with others and cooperates.
- Completing comprehensive motor assessments of individuals with disabilities and making specific program recommendations
- Providing direct services to students who are eligible and in need of APE
- Consult with physical education staff providing physical education instruction for individuals with disabilities
- Consult with other IEP team members about student need in the area of APE
- Serve as an IEP member at IEP meetings
- Monitor student progress
- Advocate for the student and parent
